

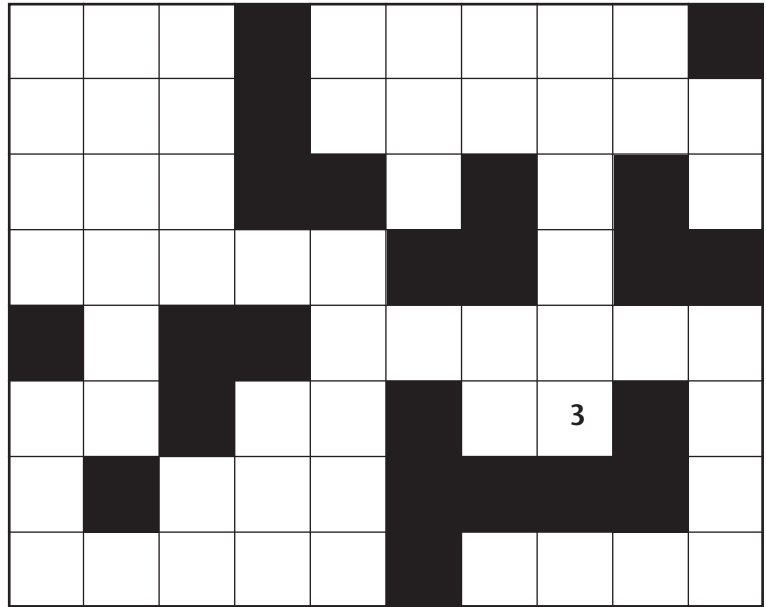

- 1856 James Keir Hardie born
- 1857 Queens Park created in Glasgow
- 1858 Bressay Lighthouse built in Shetland
- 1859 Assembly Hall of the Church of Scotland built in Edinburgh
- 1860 Scotland hosts the first Open Golf Championship
- 1861 Field Marshal Douglas Haig born
- 1862 Butt of Lewis Lighthouse built
- 1863 Café Royal built in Edinburgh
- 1864 James Clerk Maxwell presents equations describing electromagnetic fields to the Royal Society
- 1865 Last public execution in Scotland
- 1866 James Ramsay MacDonald born
- 1867 Queen’s Park Football Club formed
- 1868 Waverley Station opens in Edinburgh
- 1869 Edinburgh University becomes the first in Britain to allow women to study medicine (though not graduate)
- 1870 First rugby international played, between Scotland and England
- 1871 Glasgow Botanic Garden created
- 1872 Greyfriars’ Bobby dies
- 1873 Explorer David Livingstone dies
- 1874 Foundation stone laid for Cathedral Church of St Mary in Edinburgh
- 1875 Institute of Bankers in Scotland is formed
- 1876 Alexander Graham Bell patents the telephone
- 1877 Blantyre mining disaster
- 1878 Scotland beat Wales 9–0 at football
- 1879 Tay Bridge disaster claims 75 lives
- 1880 HM Prison Barlinnie built
- 1881 Sir Alexander Fleming born
- 1882 Crofters in Skye fight 50 policemen during a dispute over land rights
- 1883 Royal Lyceum Theatre built in Edinburgh
- 1884 Edinburgh Suburban Railway opens
- 1885 Tennent Caledonian Brewery opens in Glasgow
- 1886 Ailsa Craig lighthouse built
- 1887 Glenfiddich Distillery opens in Moray
- 1888 Celtic Football Club founded
- 1889 National Portrait Gallery for Scotland opens in Edinburgh
- 1890 Forth Rail Bridge opens
- 1891 *An Comunn Gàidhealach* formally instituted as a vehicle for the preservation and development of the Gaelic language
- 1892 Royal Observatory of Edinburgh opens
- 1893 Keir Hardie founds the Independent Labour Party
- 1894 Robert Louis Stevenson dies
- 1895 Electric light is installed in Edinburgh
- 1896 Glasgow Underground opens
- 1897 Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews recognised as the governing body for the rules of golf

- 1902 Olympic gold medallist Eric Liddell born
- 1903 Pittodrie Stadium opens in Aberdeen
- 1904 Première of JM Barrie's play *Peter Pan* in London
- 1905 Scotland play the All Blacks for the first time
- 1906 Edinburgh College of Art established
- 1907 Architect Sir Basil Spence born
- 1908 Perth racecourse opens

- 1925 Murrayfield Stadium opens in Edinburgh
- 1926 First public demonstration of television, by John Logie Baird
- 1927 Edinburgh Zoo created
- 1928 Inaugural Bannockburn Day demonstration by the National Party of Scotland in Stirling
- 1929 Playhouse Theatre built in Edinburgh
- 1930 Comedian Ronnie Corbett born
- 1931 Scottish Youth Hostel Association formed
- 1932 Museum of Edinburgh opens
- 1933 First regular air service in Scotland established, from Inverness to Wick and Orkney
- 1934 Scottish National Party is formed by the amalgamation of the National Party of Scotland and the Scottish Party
- 1935 Laurel and Hardy's *Bonnie Scotland* is released
- 1936 *Oor Willie* 'born'
- 1937 Politician Donald Dewar born
- 1938 Liner *Queen Elizabeth* launched in Clydebank
- 1939 Jackie Stewart born
- 1940 A convoy of gold bullion worth £1,800m sails from the River Clyde
- 1941 Hitler's deputy Rudolf Hess parachutes from a plane just south of Glasgow
- 1942 Billy Connolly born
- 1943 German *Luftwaffe* makes its only sustained attack on Scotland during the Second World War
- 1944 *HMS Vanguard*, Britain's biggest and last battleship, is launched at Clydebank
- 1945 First Scottish Nationalist MP is elected
- 1946 John Logie Baird dies
- 1947 First Edinburgh International Festival
- 1948 Kirkwall airport in Orkney opens
- 1949 Twelve girls die in a fire at Grafton's fashion store in Glasgow
- 1950 Scottish Nationalists steal the 'Stone of Destiny' from Westminster Abbey
- 1951 Footballer Kenny Dalglish born
- 1952 John Cobb dies while making an attempt at the world water-speed record on Loch Ness
- 1953 Tony Blair born
- 1954 Cairngorm National Nature Reserve established
- 1955 Museum of Childhood opens in Edinburgh
- 1956 Trams stop running in Dundee and Edinburgh
- 1957 Nine miners die in an explosion at Lindsay Colliery in Fife
- 1958 Denis Law becomes the youngest footballer to play for Scotland
- 1959 Scotland's first nuclear power station opens at Chapelcross in Dumfriesshire
- 1960 Elvis Presley lands in Scotland for two hours
- 1961 *USS Proteus* arrives in the Holy Loch to set up the Polaris nuclear submarine base
- 1962 Scottish Opera founded
- 1963 The last hanging in Scotland – 21-year-old Henry Burnett is executed for the murder of seaman Thomas Guyan
- 1964 Forth road bridge opens
- 1965 Racing circuit at Ingleston near Edinburgh opens
- 1966 Heriot-Watt University established
- 1967 Celtic win the European Cup
- 1968 Motor racing champion Jim Clark dies in a crash at Hockenheim
- 1969 Meadowbank Stadium opens in Edinburgh
- 1970 Kingston Bridge over the River Clyde in Glasgow officially opens
- 1971 Ken Buchanan wins the world lightweight boxing championship
- 1972 Rangers win the European Cup-Winners' Cup
- 1973 SNP candidate Margo MacDonald overturns a Labour majority of 16,000 to win the Glasgow Govan by-election
- 1974 Scottish National Party polls 839,628 votes (30.44%) and wins 11 seats in Westminster general election
- 1975 North sea oil first comes ashore
- 1976 David Steel becomes leader of the Liberal Party
- 1977 Passenger terminal at Edinburgh Airport (Turnhouse) opens
- 1978 Sullom Voe oil terminal opens in Shetland
- 1979 Scots vote in favour of devolution, but fail to reach the required 40% of the population in favour of implementing it
- 1980 Peterhead power station opens
- 1981 Royal Insurance Group's headquarters moves from Edinburgh to Glasgow
- 1982 Pope John Paul II visits Glasgow
- 1983 Aberdeen win the European Cup-Winners' Cup
- 1984 Thirteen people are killed when a train hits a cow on the track near Falkirk and derailed
- 1985 Freuchie wins the Village Cricket Cup at Lord's cricket ground
- 1986 Forty-five crew and oilrig workers die when a Chinook helicopter crashes into the sea off Sumburgh Head, Shetland
- 1987 Royal Bank of Scotland issues its 11ay series of banknotes
- 1988 Lockerbie air disaster
- 1989 Conservative government introduces the poll tax in Scotland
- 1990 Scotland achieves rugby's grand slam for the third time
- 1991 St Andrews Museum opens
- 1992 Traverse Theatre is built in Edinburgh
- 1993 Liberian-registered oil tanker *Braer* hits rocks off the Shetland Islands
- 1994 Labour Party leader John Smith dies
- 1995 Isle of Arran Distillery opens
- 1996 Dolly the sheep is born
- 1997 Ken Doherty beats Stephen Hendry to become world professional snooker champion
- 1998 Scotland's first Hard Rock Café opens in Edinburgh
- 1999 A Scottish Parliament is reinstated
- 2000 Pop star Madonna marries film producer Guy Ritchie at Skibo Castle
- 2001 Glasgow Science Centre opens
- 2002 All-Scots women's curling team wins gold at the winter Olympics
- 2003 MTV Music Awards are held in Scotland for the first time
- 2004 First female moderator of the Church of Scotland formally appointed
- 2005 Politician Robin Cook dies
